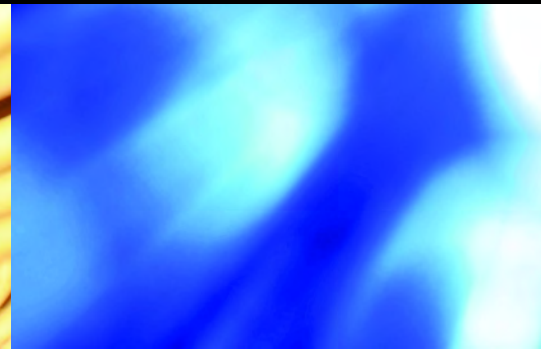

Dear Members

Welcome to the 2011 Lighting Association Presidents report. The past 12 months has seen yet again many pressures to bear in much of the industry, yet we have seen signs of stability or dare I say even recovery. The LA has fared remarkably well these past 12 months, with much of the cost reductions and belt tightening assisting to keep our association in the black. Well done to our CEO Peter Hunt and his team for all their part played in achieving this.

Chief Executive's Message

Dear Members

The disruptive technology that is LEDs is bringing about more changes in our industry than perhaps any of us expected. The impact of the technology cuts right across every sector from lamps and commercial luminaires to street lighting, electronics, controls and although the domestic sector has yet to embrace it in a significant way it is coming.

Many of the traditional boundaries are breaking down, some of the lamp makers are now finding themselves in the luminaire business and vice versa. Even our EU legislators are confused about whether an LED luminaire is in fact a lamp or a light fixture.

In recent years this removal of barriers has led to increased co-operation between the various organisations representing different areas of the lighting business. Our liaison group has been extended to include a broad range of lighting related interests and we now find ourselves talking much more closely with lighting designers, installers, retailers and every part of the supply chain.

In Europe the two principle organisations representing lamps (ELC) and the luminaire and component associations (CELMA) are in merger talks to form a new 'Lighting Europe'.

At home the LA has been working increasingly closely with the Lighting Industry Federation over the last 3 years and where ever possible we try to arrive at a joint industry position when responding, for example, to government consultations. So productive has this co-operation been that both Councils of Management agreed to set up a joint working group to explore areas where we could expand this co-operation. Their conclusion was that we had probably gone as far as possible as two separate organisations which compete for members but that there would be some significant advantages in merging the two.

A specially formed sub-group consisting of the President and Vice President of both organitions together with the CEO's have spent a considerable amount of time developing a model for a new association which would be greater than the sum of the individual parts. This model was presented to both Councils at a meeting in May and was given

unanimous approval. The next step is a period of consultation during July and August ahead of an Extraordinary General Meeting to be held towards the end of September when members will have the opportunity to vote on the proposal. A prospectus for the new organisation will be sent to members in early September.

In the meantime I would be delighted to take calls and questions from any member who wishes to learn more about what the new organisation will deliver.

The Lighting Association Technical Committee

2010/2011

The last year (2010/2011) has been a busy time for the Lighting Association Technical Committee (LATC).

One of the main challenges in 2010 was the change of policy on RoHS (Restriction of the use of Hazardous Substances) for domestic luminaires in the UK such that the complete luminaire must be RoHS compliant. Government department BIS (Business, Innovation and Skills) and the National Measurement Office (NMO), who enforce RoHS in the UK, highlighted this change mid 2010. Through discussions with BIS and NMO the LA have negotiated a delayed implementation date of 1 September 2011 allowing members some additional time to comply.

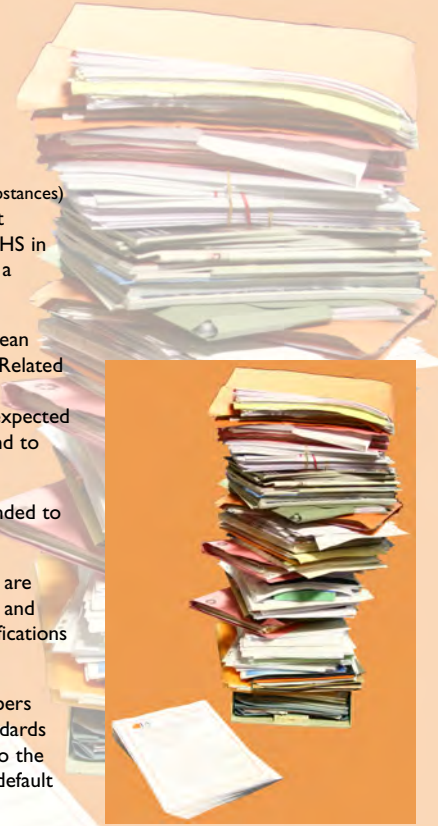
The LATC, both directly and via the EU Association CELMA, have continued to provide input to the European Commission on the drafting of the implementing measure for directional lamps as part of the new Energy Related Products Directive (ERP). The implementing measure draft was eventually issued in June 2011, this will be followed by a consultation forum and industry meetings throughout the year. The final Regulation is now expected to be published in 2012. Industry input into these discussions is critical to minimise any negative impact and to maintain a smooth transition to new technologies without removing consumer choice.

In parallel to the ERP implementing measure draft, proposals for the new Energy Label, which will be expanded to include non-domestic lamps, directional lamps and LED lamps have also been received.

Standardisation activities, as expected, have been focussed on LEDs. Publicly Available Specifications (PAS) are now available for the performance of LED modules and LED luminaires. With published PAS now available and with increasing industry awareness and promotion via CELMA and National trade associations, these specifications should bring some harmony into how manufacturers claims are made and allow true comparison.

LA Information Sheets and LA Technical Bulletins still form the main route for communication to LA members concerning new legislation and other matters important to the industry. LA IS15 continues to list the standards relevant to lighting and this is updated regularly by LA Technical Bulletins. Also LA IS 61, which is specific to the LED area, is being regularly updated to track new LED standards as they become available and is now the default document used by CELMA and other National trade associations. All LA IS and LA TB are available in the members area of the [LA website](#).

For the coming year (2011/2012) there are still many challenges. Changes to RoHS and WEEE (Waste Electrical & Electronic Equipment) will be finalised, proposals for the 2013 & 2016 Building Regulations Part L will be agreed, the ERP Regulation for directional and LED lamps will be published as well as the new energy labelling requirements. The LATC will actively discuss these subjects and keep members informed.

Membership

This year continued to provide challenging times for many. We can however, report a strong resurgence in new members, having 19 successful applications during 2010, taking our membership to 200.

Participation - CoP Accreditation

Participation in the LA Accreditation (CoP) not only provides an annual Audit review and test equipment calibration but an opportunity to discuss specific queries in detail and ensure that relevant procedures are available and processes correctly performed. In addition the documentation required to be available by Law, including a review for RoHS, WEEE, REACH and ErP requirements are considered.

We can report that the introduction of the annually issued Accreditation (CoP) Certificate has been well received and seen in evidence displayed on stands at NEC Interiors Lighting Exhibition, as well as member premises. We shall continue to seek closer liaison with members to consider how best to promote the important and significant of Accreditation to their range of customers.

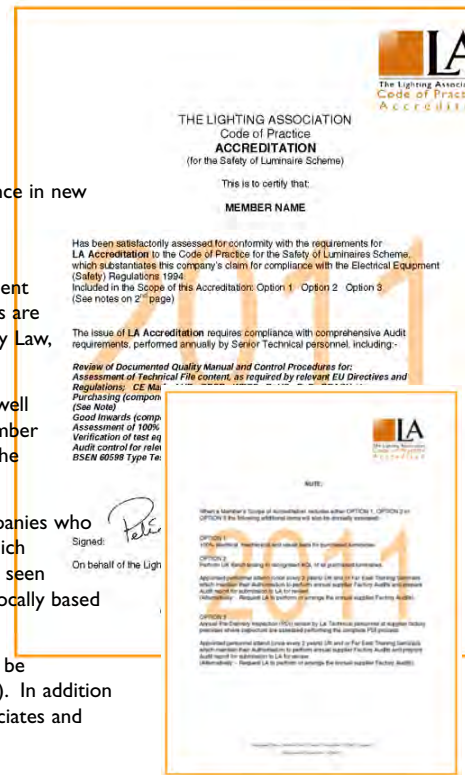
Participation is a membership requirement (sanctioned by Council of Management) for non-ISO companies who manufacture or import luminaires. An on-going review has resulted in additional CoP participation which resulted in overall numbers being maintained. Far East Factory Audits and Pre-Delivery Inspection has seen an increase as more members seek an LA review of new and existing suppliers, as well as their own locally based Inspection provision.

The LA Technical Manager will be developing additional UK support to enable extra member visits to be performed. This assistance is to be provided by LA Laboratory personnel (subject to their availability). In addition we look to develop more assistance in the Far East to expand that provided by long established Associates and Organisations.

Seminar Training

The continued training program for LA members and factory personnel has seen more Seminars performed and this was one of the elements observed when Peter Hunt, the LA CEO visited China to consider current and future China Support Services.

We have noted during Audits at some China factories (who can demonstrate compliance with various quality and customer Audits) that there can often be deviation from the accepted methods of routine electrical testing procedure. These vitally important tests are demonstrated during LA factory Audits and one of the elements included during LA Training Seminars in China.

Safety of Luminaires Scheme

We therefore consider that these Seminars are a very important method to enable a clear understanding of the correct testing procedures, essential for product safety and seek to promote this cost-effective training.

Following several meetings over a number of visits we can report that the LA is developing an Auditor Training program with a major organisation based in GuangDong Province.

Key advantages at this facility are the location and services available, a lighting test laboratory with photometric, RoHS and REACH testing, proximity to factories for training in a working environment and the ability to accommodate larger numbers attending LA Seminars.

Test Equipment

A number of members have benefited from the loan of test equipment (held at LAHQ) in times of breakdown or where additional testing capacity required at short-notice.



The introduction of an LA Authorised Fault Simulator (for Chinese test equipment,) removed the disparity between UK and China test process with proven advantage over the 'short-circuit' check method normally observed.



A range of continuity test probes and torque test tools are now available for commonly used lamp holder types. A device is currently under development which will provide improved safety during function testing.

Retailer and Manufacturers Training Courses

These saw continued enrolment and we can report a special Seminar was performed for LED in Ireland which proved a more cost-effective method for their QC team to complete the course.

Re-invent, morph, diversify, make ready for a changing world of lighting.
These are the watch words to ensure the LAL's continued success as a key service provider.

Whilst certain sectors of the lighting industry have suffered in recent times due to the effects of the economic downturn, the activity of the LAL has remained robust with sales turnover, once again exceeding expectation and budget predictions for the last financial year.

The lighting sector is changing and the pace of that change is increasing rapidly. Solid State Lighting (SSL) represents a highly disruptive technology area and along with many other lighting companies the LAL has needed to respond and diversify into new testing areas to serve the needs of our clients.

Once again we have added to our capabilities. We have harboured plans for some time to secure certification for the North American market. To this end we have teamed with TUV Rheinland UK Ltd such that the LAL can test your product leading to a cTUVus mark. Again despite tales of credit crunch doom and gloom the first certificate has been issued where the client is a LA Member Company.

Demand has increased for our photometric testing services particularly for LED based lamps and luminaires. Our Goniophotometric facility enables us to produce design data files suitable for most lighting design software packages including RELUX and DIALux. In line with international certification requirements for LED products we have invested in the capability to assess UV emissions in accordance with BS EN 62471.

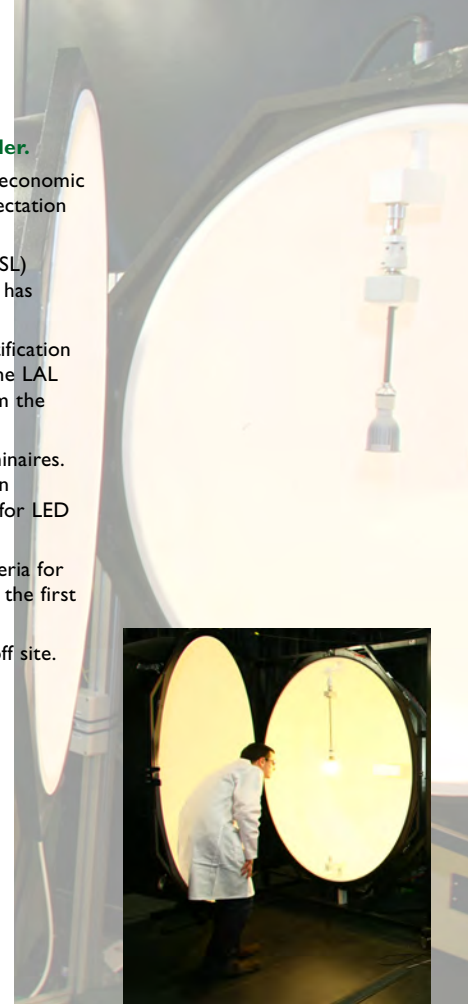
Over the last months we have worked closely with the Energy Saving Trust (EST) to develop test criteria for the EST's Energy Saving Recommended (ESR) LED product. I'm delighted to report that test work on the first submission against the EST's LED requirements specification has begun.

Some time ago we recognised that there was a gap in the market for test and investigation services off site. Since then our people have operated over the length and breadth of the UK and internationally.

Lighting Dispute Resolution

Problems and Disputes

Occasionally installed lighting goes wrong. Often the root cause of the issue is unclear. The luminaire manufacturer might believe that the installing contractor has made a mistake or the installer believes the luminaire is not fit for purpose. Either way the problem is not being resolved leaving the end client to bear the pain.

We offer an investigation and arbitration facility to help resolve the issues and thus facilitate a solution based approach where costly lawyers often inflate the problem and serve only to increase costs on all sides.

The aim is to offer a positive solution delivering improvement action advice helping to prevent repeat occurrences of related problems.

On site test facility

One key area where our test service has proved beneficial is in the area of UMSUG (Unmetered Supply User Group). The power consumption of equipment needs to be monitored and sometimes the equipment is large and the cost of delivering it to a test house is enormous as well as inconvenient. In this case we can come to you.

Another area, again with large bespoke lighting solutions, is product safety risk assessments. We can provide an expert to assess a lighting product and give a view on its safety.

Independent Expertise

The LAL has worked closely with the Energy Saving Trust to monitor before and after retrofit of Solid State Lighting for their LED's Corridor project.

Our team have visited Local Authority sites around the country to assess energy usage and lighting levels and to report on the outcomes whether positive or negative. We can already see that there have been successes which will enable the EST to expand the project in the future.

Performance Verification Scheme

Does your product do what it says on the tin?

The Lighting Association's Performance Verification Scheme with a touch of market surveillance for good measure



We now have a scheme in place where clients can commission the LA Lab to performance verify their product and gain the right to use the mark shown opposite.

Safety - We do know that good performing product might not be safe, product has been pulled from the market for safety issues. We need to ensure safety is addressed as the starting point.

Performance - Performance verification really does mean looking at the data on the product labels, pack or data sheet. Making a measurement and deciding if it's OK, or not. Examples of parameters which will be verified are; Total Lumen Output, CCT and Ra, Power (circuit watts) consumed, Efficacy, Centre beam intensity, Beam Angle

Once a product is verified the LA will allow the use of the logo for safety and performance only. Additionally all the information will be posted on www.lalabverified.com in support of the manufacturer's claims.

Life - Life is synonymous with lumen maintenance. Thermal conditions of associated components can also be a factor, thermal conditions will also be considered. Life will be verified at a real 6000 hr test duration of the actual product, in a working environment. Data will be published to show the lumen maintenance achieved at 6000 hrs. It will also be possible to publish data beyond 6000 hrs for those products that are held on extended test.

Market Surveillance - Performance Verified Products will be sampled from time to time to assure continued compliance. We will also undertake random market surveillance of product in the market place. A dedicated area will be created on www.lalabverified.com where these results will be published.

Interiors Birmingham - Lighting Design Awards for 2011 went to...

On 24 January 2011 the industry came together to celebrate the best designs and stands exhibiting at this years Interiors Show (23-26 Jan Birmingham NEC).

A wide range of entries at this year Lighting Show awards resulted in much deliberation by the judges who included winners from the 2010 Student Lighting Design Awards. The overall winner was not so much a product as a concept in display. The Jezza in-store display unit from Endon Lighting was not only a high quality construction but it enabled 60 products to be lit and displayed in a footprint of just one square metre. Remote controls allow individual switching and new products can easily be installed by clipping in a replacement panel.

Other winners saw a simple glass table lamp in vibrant colours from Pacific Lifestyle Ltd, a sustainable steamed wood pendant from new exhibitor Tom Raffield and a high output LED downlight from Illuma Lighting.

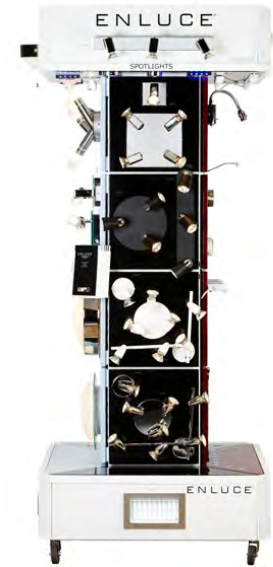

CELMA

CELMA is an organisation based in Brussels of which the LA was a founding member. It consists of 19 lighting trade associations across Europe and represents over 1000 lighting companies. This is our direct route to lobbying the EU Commission and liaising with other associations to present, where possible, a united voice.

This route to Europe has been invaluable for the LA over the years and regularly results in us having face to face meetings with the Brussels legislators to enable us to explain the UK industry position. The LA has, through this organisation, helped shape EU legislation.

Another organisation based in the same building in Brussels and representing the major lamp manufacturers is called the ELC (European Lamp Companies Federation). Over the past few years CELMA and ELC have worked increasingly closely to agree, where possible, a joint position to present to the EU Commission. More recently there have been joint working groups and an inevitable consequence of this increased co-operation is the proposal to merge the two organisations to create one.

Peter Hunt is an elected member of the Executive Board and is also on the task force working on this merger which, if the vote at the November General Assembly is positive will see a new organisation called Lighting Europe emerge early in 2012.
